<a href="#">Publications</a>	Under this bill, the following information concerning a handgun carry permit would be confidential and not open to public inspection or to publication:
<a href="#">Tennessee Code</a>	(1) All information contained in any application for a permit or renewal application, and in any materials required for a permit;
<a href="#">Archive</a>	(2) All information provided to any state or federal agency, to any county, municipality, or other political subdivision, to any official, agent, or employee of any state or federal agency, or obtained by any state or federal agency in the course of its investigation of an applicant; and
<b>District Maps</b>	(3) Any and all records maintained relative to any application for a permit or renewal application, or the issuance, renewal, expiration, suspension, or revocation of a permit, or the result of any criminal history record check.
<b>Other Links</b>	Any information or other records regarding an applicant or permit holder may be released to a law enforcement agency for the purpose of conducting an investigation or prosecution, or for determining the validity of a permit. Other than this provision, it would be a Class E felony for a person to knowingly publish in any form any information or records described in this bill or the validity of any permit.
