Please be advised by your receipt of this letter that we have been retained by Ms. Donna Jackson to protect her rights with respect to your engagement of her services for the purpose of acting as External Evaluator of the application for a 21st Century Community Learning Center (CCLC) grant.

Ms. Jackson has provided detailed documentation of the services she performed on your behalf with regard to the CCLC grant, as well as evidence of the very extensive experience she has with this particular grant, which experience was instrumental in your schools' reward of the grant. She has further provided information sufficient to cause reasonable concern on her part that you may be contemplating a failure to compensate her for services, worth a total of approximately \$31,500.00 over the next three years. Ms. Jackson is hopeful that this is not the case.

Therefore, please be advised that Ms. Jackson is hereby requesting a meeting within the next fifteen (15) days with you and all relevant persons required to approve a payment plan for the purpose of establishing a mutually agreeable plan of compensating Ms. Jackson for her services. Please be further advised that failure to meet and reach agreement on a plan for compensating Ms. Jackson for her services could result in further legal action. Should further legal action be required, you may be responsible to pay attorney's fees and costs of litigation if you do not prevail.

It is not the desire of Ms. Jackson to litigate this matter, but you are advised that she is prepared to pursue all legal remedies available to her in the event you fail to meet to agree on a payment plan to compensate her for her services. Please contact my office at your earliest possible convenience in order to schedule a meeting.
